All About Asparagus

Summer is the prime season for asparagus. A member of the lily family (along with onions, leeks, and garlic), the vegetable got its name from the Greek "asparagos," which means a sprout or shoot. It comes in several colors: green, the most common variety; white, which is grown without exposure to sunlight; and purple, which has a fruitier flavor than green or white asparagus.

Asparagus is a nutrient-dense food, high in folate (which helps produce and maintain new cells), and a good source of potassium, fiber, vitamin B6, vitamins A and C, and thiamin. It has no fat or cholesterol, and is low in sodium.

When you're shopping for asparagus, look for stalks that are rounded rather than fat or twisted; firm, thin stems with deep green or purplish closed tips; and the cut ends should not be too woody, although a little woodiness at the base prevents the stalk from drying out. Store asparagus in the refrigerator with the ends wrapped in a damp paper towel, and place it in the back of the refrigerator away from any light, since folate is destroyed by exposure to air, heat or light. Use within a day or two after purchasing for the best flavor.

A Lesson In Persistence

According to legend, the 14th century Scottish king, Robert the Bruce, was once hiding out from English pursuers on a remote island. Defeated and without hope, he noticed a spider trying painfully to fix its web onto a wooden beam. The spider tried again and again, only to fail each time. But it wouldn't quit. And, after many, many tries, it succeeded. Inspired by this example of persistence, Robert the Bruce organized a new band of followers and, against great odds, drove the English out of Scotland.

Was It A Goodyear? No - The Worst

Did you know that nearly 40 years after Charles Goodyear died in 1860, his brother-in-law went on to found and name the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company in his honor? And that's basically all Charles received for his hard work.

Long considered the inventor of the rubber tire that now bears his name – an innovation that would later have a major impact on the future of the world economy – Charles only made a measly \$50,000 from it. Though he invented the method which manufactured rubber tires, it was Thomas Hancock who took all the glory in Great Britain in 1844.

Charles, it turns out, made an unfortunate mistake: He revealed his secret invention to Thomas, hoping the two could work together. Instead, Hancock, who ran a rubber-manufacturing company in Britain, stole Goodyear's idea, filed for a patent and used it in Europe. That left Goodyear high and dry, and he eventually sold the American patent to his brother-in-law for \$50,000.
