How to Use a Fire Extinguisher

Knowing how to use a fire extinguisher is crucial for ensuring safety and minimizing damage during a fire emergency. To start a fire extinguisher quickly and use it properly, remember PASS:

P: Pull the pin to discharge material.

A: Aim low. Point to spray at the bottom of the blaze first.

S: Squeeze the lever above the handle to operate and release it to stop the spray.

S: Sweep the extinguisher from side to side until the flames are out.

Always ensure the fire extinguisher is fully charged and easily accessible.

Regularly check expiration dates and service the extinguisher as needed.



Advantages of Electronic Bikes

Here is a way to strengthen yourself, improve your heart health, boost your mood and thinking power, and provide adventure: e-bikes.

That's right, electric bikes, or e-bikes, are pedal bikes fitted with a motor. Adult trikes also can be fitted with a motor.

According to a 2019 U.K. study, e-bikes might provide older adults with more physical and mental benefits than conventional bikes. A group of 100 older adults, ages 50-83, participated in the study. Half of the group rode conventional bikes; the other half rode e-bikes. Each participant rode at least three times a week for 30 minutes.

The e-bike riders showed similar or greater benefits than the pedal cyclists. Researchers concluded that the benefits come from physical activity and engagement with the outdoor environment, such as riding longer and going more places.

According to National Geographic, most riders use a low pedal assist power setting. Riders are pedaling, but not quite as hard, which helps them cash in on a host of benefits. Studies also show that e-riders have reduced stress, sleep better, and are generally happier.

E-bike clubs provide companionship on bike paths and trails. E-bikes are available with a wide range of configurations and price points. You can buy an e-trike, such as the Liberty Trike, for



about \$2,000. This small and foldable adult trike holds riders up to 300 pounds and can be used in some public places as a mobility device.

Other bikes and trikes retail from \$2,000 to as much as \$13,000, although lighter bikes are the more expensive ones

Top Priority for Flights: Legroom

It's become the most important issue in airline travel: Legroom.

Seat pitch is the key measurement that tells you if your legs will be touching your chin when you fly. The more

inches of seat pitch you have, the better. Seat pitch is the distance from any point on one seat to the exact same point on the seat in front (or behind).

Since the 1980s, American, Delta, Southwest and United have all lost at least 2 inches in seat pitch, according to *Conde Nast Traveler*. The average pitch today is about 31 inches. The carrier with the greatest seat pitch is JetBlue with 32.3 inches on its Airbus A320 and A321. Southwest Airlines is next with 31.8 inches. Alaska and Delta airlines clock in at 31 inches, with American at 30.2 and United at 30.1, according to Kiplinger.com.

This concave bottom design has one essential use. It makes it possible for the thin aluminum can to hold the pressure created by the carbonated soda. That's 90 pounds of pressure, or about six times greater than ground-level atmospheric pressure.

But that's not all. The bevel is encircled by an inset ridge. This allows you to neatly stack the cans, one on top of another.

And finally, a little-known superpower: The ridge actually lets you open another can. Demonstrated by TikToker Jordan the Stallion, you can put one can on top of another, then use the ridge to catch and lift the pull tab. It opens neatly and your nails won't break.

Scientists Turn Peanut Butter into Diamonds

Dan Frost of the Bayerisches Geoinstitut in Germany was trying to replicate crystalline structures believed to exist in the lower mantle of the Earth.



During his research, Frost discovered a laboratory process that extracts the oxygen from carbon-dioxide. In the earth, this happens naturally, and when the left-over carbon is subjected to intense pressure, it can turn into diamonds.

To replicate this in the lab, Frost's team needed a carbon-rich material, which they could subject to high pressure. They chose ordinary peanut butter. During the experiment, diamonds did actually emerge under extremely high pressure.

The experiment was done to demonstrate how turning carbon-rich materials into diamonds can be useful in superconductors and quantum computing.

What About Mortgage Rates?

Mortgage rates have dipped again at the end of August, largely due to growing expectations that the Federal Reserve may soon cut interest rates. This trend of declining mortgage rates is expected to continue, providing potential relief for prospective homebuyers who have been waiting on the sidelines.

However, despite the drop in rates, the anticipated surge in home purchasing activity has yet to materialize. Many buyers remain cautious, hoping for further decreases before re-entering the market. Until mortgage rates fall more significantly, a strong rebound in home purchases is likely to remain out of reach, as affordability challenges continue to dampen buyer enthusiasm.

Even though foreclosure numbers were up in 2023, they were still down 28% compared to 2019, and down by 88% compared to the numbers in 2010 that were caused by the Great Recession.

Another positive note is that most of the homes in foreclosure today likely will not be repossessed by lenders like they were during the Great Recession. This is because unlike the foreclosures in 2010, many of the borrowers in today's market have positive equity (their homes are worth more than they owe). That is a positive tool they can use to avoid foreclosure by selling their house before that happens.

For homeowners, this means that the value of your homes won't drop due to many foreclosures.

As for investors and buyers looking for a great deal, you will still be able to find your share, but it won't be anything like 2010.
